Sending Caddies to College Since 1930

2016-17 Program Overview



The Evans Scholars Foundation awards full tuition and housing scholarships to high-achieving caddies with limited financial means. Established in 1930 by the Western Golf Association and celebrated amateur golfer Charles “Chick” Evans Jr., the Foundation administers the nation’s largest scholarship program for caddies. Currently, 935 students are enrolled at 20 universities, including 15 where the Evans Scholars Foundation operates Scholarship Houses. More than 10,400 men and women have graduated as Evans Scholars.

With tuition rates on the rise, paying for college has become increasingly difficult for many families. In recent years, record numbers of caddies have applied for the Evans Scholarship, showing that the need is greater than ever. To meet these challenges, the Foundation plans to grow the number of Scholars living in community to 1,000 by 2020, while expanding the Program geographically from coast to coast. Today, more than 30,000 Par Club donors support the Evans Scholars Foundation. The Foundation is also the sole beneficiary of the BMW Championship, a PGA TOUR FedExCup Playoff event conducted by the Western Golf Association. To learn more, please visit www.wgaesf.org.
